



Reflections on lessons in university leadership

Stay calm and react quickly.

You have to be calm, but not still-water calm

Collaborate.

You are not going to know all the answers - no one expects you to.

This is a time to call on the resources, the capabilities of all of your staff team members and bring them together in taskforces, sub-taskforces, etc.

Communicate and inform.

With staff, students, partners, etc.

If they aren't informed and don't understand what is going on, communications is more difficult.

Lessons of Leadership

- Curriculum planning
 - Face to face studies (unlikely)
 - Remote / partly remote studies
- A well-defined timeline (for faculty and staff) to implement course materials and instructional components in an online format
- Informative meetings planning

Planning for the new academic year: Transforming challenges into opportunities

Teaching: online only or blended (20,30 40%!)

Students: recruitment, orientation, activities, etc...

Faculty: training on remote pedagogies (it is not simply PowerPoint!)

Resources: management of financial and human

Research and Assessment of remote / virtual learning

Community outreach: public awareness, social media. Etc...





What are the future plans? Are we ready for Fall 2020/2021? Improving experiential education and simulation

Compilation of cases: Data Bank accessible to preceptors and clinical faculty members

Workshops: for preceptors on continuous development of remote experiential learning

Practice sites agreement: to allow continuation of student rotations during future possible lockdowns

Recruitment: of students to volunteer in COVID-19 units

Hybrid rotations: Online and onsite (few hours of attendance per week)
